

WASHINGTON STREET MAINTENANCE ASSESSMENT DISTRICT COMMITTEE

- The Washington Street Maintenance Assessment District Committee (“WSMAD”) shall be composed of seven members, who shall be appointed by the MHTC president, with approval by the board of trustees.
- The WSMAD Committee shall function as a standing committee under the Mission Hills Town Council and shall make regular reports to the MHTC board of trustees and the MHTC Business Enhancement Committee.
- WSMAD committee actions and recommendations shall not require the approval of the MHTC board of trustees, except as relates to proposed changes to the existing Boundary Map and Assessment Diagram for the district.
- WSMAD committee membership shall endeavor to include representation from the MHTC, the Mission Hills Garden Club, the Mission Hills Business Improvement District, Mission Hills Heritage and/or Uptown Partnership.

MISSION STATEMENT

The Washington Street Maintenance Assessment District Committee shall serve as an advisory body to Special District’s staff as relates to the existing maintenance assessment district that was originally formed in July, 1993, and re-engineered in 1999 for compliance with Proposition 218.

WSMAD Committee objectives include:

- Implement elements of the September 17, 1996 Washington Street Beautification Master Plan and the MHTC-approved Vision Plan through the district budget and other funding sources.
- Provide input to City of San Diego staff as relates to the quality of contract services as relates to the district.
- Recommend annual assessment amounts to City of San Diego staff and the City Council.
- Review and advise City of San Diego staff as to proposed annual district budgets.
- Explore changes to the existing Boundary Map and Assessment Diagram for the district to increase assessment revenues.
